

GCSE food technology practical exam

On Thursday this week this year's GCSE students began their practical exam work. The students have spent several weeks preparing for the exam in which they had to prepare three dishes including side dishes over a three-hour period. They had a choice of three themes, but they all chose to celebrate foods from North and South America.

They researched the dishes from these countries also looking at health issues that people from these countries have. They decided on 10-12 dishes but settled on three in which the twelve skills they needed to demonstrate could be shown. They then decided on three dishes they would choose for the practical exam whilst at the same time adapting them to make the dishes healthier.

Once the dishes were finalised the students then created a three-hour dove-tailed time-plan. Throughout the exam the students were very focused and produced the most amazing dishes, which were taste tested for the sensory analysis.
