Food Science

This week Eagles and Sparrow Hawks made a delicious healthy fruit salad. We talked about knife safety, how to chop using a claw grip as well as how to carry a knife safely. Students were interested to learn about how oxidation starts to take place as soon as the air touches the slices and how by using an acid such as lemon or orange juice it slows it down. The Star Baker award went to Mason Michaelides.







Buzzards this week made some tasty bread rolls. We talked about how yeast works as a raising agent. The students had a good work-out, kneading their bread for 10 minutes and finding out how kneading allows the protein molecules in the flour to form by creating healthy gluten strands. Gluten is what helps the mixture to rise and build texture. The students weighed their mixture then divided the dough into 6 rolls. We also used an all-in-one proving and baking method where the rolls were put into a cold oven which was then turned up to its hottest setting. The students were impressed how easy it is to make bread. The Star Baker Award went to Taryn Swift.





Fire Talk

On Friday 5th May the older students at Brooke House were given a talk on fire safety by a representative from Leicestershire Fire & Rescue.

Students watched a film and were asked questions on their knowledge of fire safety prior to the talk, to assess existing knowledge. They were asked if they knew how many fire stations there are in Leicestershire and Rutland, how many water pumps there are in the area and how long it takes for a fire to spread around a room.

The film started with a real-time view of a fire starting in a bedroom with a timer showing how quickly a fire can spread around a room, showing footage of the destructive power of an uncontrolled fire. Through this part of the video, the students learnt how a fire spreads and how smoke ignites. Advice was given on creating a fire escape plan; the importance of having a plan. They were also given advice on keeping downstairs doors closed at night as they help to slow the spread of fires.

Students were shown a range of smoke detectors and the importance of ensuring that

batteries are changed. They were given advice on the best locations for smoke detectors, as well as advice on getting rid of damaged smoke detectors.

The students were shown cartoon pictures of rooms at home and had to identify a range of fire risks in the room. They were then given advice on how to remedy the fire risks shown in the pictures. Finally, students were spoken to about prank calls to the Fire Service, and the deliberate starting of fires (arson). The talk ended with a quiz to assess the students' knowledge.

Reception also enjoyed a talk about what Firefighters do and how to ring 999. They watched a fun cartoon video about safety in the house which involved one very naughty talking dog who did everything wrong! The instructor then moved on to safety in the car — the children came out of the talk buzzing, telling everyone about wearing seat belts and not using mobile phones when driving!

Eds. Note – this was followed by a termly Fire Drill in school this week – so there has been a lot of talk about fire safety.
