The award this week goes to Thomas Lee for improvement in the harder times tables group.





The Mathematics Star for this week goes to Edward Dixon for his accurate drawing when reflecting shapes.




Mathematics Work of the Week by Lily Swift for working well when finding the area of composite shapes


This weeks questions to find the areas of complex shapes were answered by one of our year 6 students. Answers to follow next week.






Follow that Route

Reception children learnt about maps this week; they looked at a book that had maps in it explaining that a map is like a 'bird's eye view' of the landscape. They learnt that we use maps to find out where things are and make journeys. To make a map you need to imagine what things look like from above, as if you were a bird flying over the landscape. They also learnt that a landmark is a feature that you can see clearly, such as a church with a steeple. Landmarks help you find your way around a village. Landmarks are shown on most maps as signs, or symbols. Map symbols can be letters or simple drawings.

They then had great fun drawing maps of the route to the allotments – when they had completed them, they then followed the route using their maps to test them out. They were very excited when the route worked!!
