Air Ambulance

We had a very interesting talk from the Air Ambulance this week at Brooke House. Students learnt how the Air Ambulance team have just completed 50,000 missions and also recently had 19 call outs in one day! Which was a first for them!

Students had an informative talk about the team — learning that each flight consists of one pilot, one critical care paramedic and one Doctor some of the staff are part funded by the NHS but otherwise the Air Ambulance have to rely on sponsorship and donations to be able to run their services. They are not a government funded service.

They operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year attending emergencies ranging from minor/major traffic collisions to other incidents such as people being knocked down or incidents on football pitches or in parks — often in areas inaccessible to cars or ambulances. They have 2 helicopters and 2 cars to attend incidents. As the only disadvantage to the helicopters is they can't fly at night or in really bad weather.

One of the main reasons they are called out is because of the speed they can get to an incident – the helicopter travels at 185 miles an hour and the teams target is to be at an incident within 13 minutes and airborne in 3 minutes! - Which is quite an achievement – I bet they have lots of cold cups of tea!!

They also run the Children's Air Ambulance which is a service that can transport critically ill children to hospitals across the UK for treatment.

Brooke House students enjoyed the talk and watched an action-packed video of a helicopter in action. They then had lots of questions and came out of the talk inspired – trying to decide whether they would be a pilot or a doctor!

The Air Ambulance run shops around the County that accept donations of pre-loved items or monetary donations can be made direct or maybe we will run our next fundraising event for them?

The Mathematics Star for this week goes to Rayyan Tailor for attaining a good mark in his first test this academic year. A good start well done.




