Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to **write a story they would love to read** without the pressure of having to worry about spelling, punctuation and grammar.

The 500 Word judges are back; award-winning and best-selling authors **Frank Cottrell-Boyce**, **Francesca Simon**, **Charlie Higson**, and former children's laureate, **Malorie Blackman**. We are delighted to say that this year there will be a new addition to the panel, TV legend and children's author, **Sir Lenny Henry**. The judges will be casting their expert eyes over the final 50 stories.

The winners will be featured in a special 500 Word programme with **The One Show at Buckingham Palace**, on World Book Day on 7 March 2024.

Our students are really excited and started writing some brilliant ideas straight away. We can't wait to read their entries. We will also hold our own competition and award prizes for the best stories.

Bat Walk


