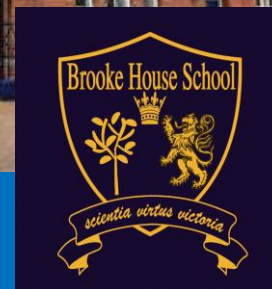

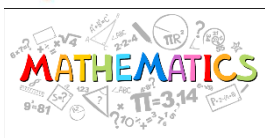


Times Tables Champion

The award this week goes to Emmie Parker for full marks in a quick time in this week's test.



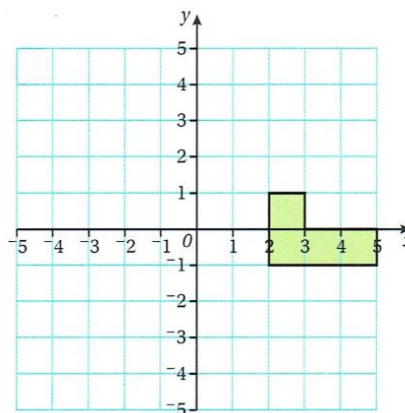
The Mathematics Star for this week goes to Taryn Swift for working hard this week on perimeter and area, also for improvement in her presentation.

- Reflect this shape in the line $y = x$, and then reflect the shape and the resultant image in the line $y = -x$.

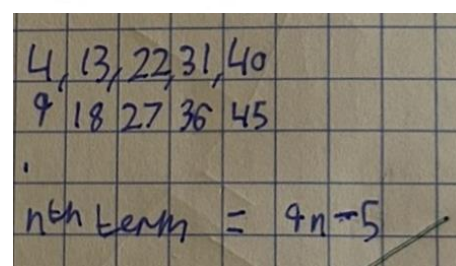
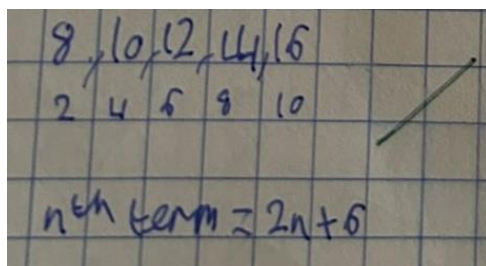
