#### **County Lines**

This week in school we have been following up our knife crime talk from Leicestershire Constabulary by having class discussions on County Lines. County Lines is where illegal drugs are transported from one area to another, often across police and local

The 'County Line' is the mobile phone line (or other form of "deal line") used to take the orders of drugs. Importing areas (areas where the drugs are taken to) are reporting increased levels of violence and weapons-related crimes as a result of this trend.

We realised that anyone buying 'weed' is vulnerable to County Lines as you are opening a door to the Black-Market economy. In particular, we discussed how you might be asked to launder money for a friend (put £500 through your bank account and then give them back £400), or be asked to look after goods for a friend, or collect a parcel from an Amazon lock up and keep it in your bedroom. Students were made aware that County Lines involvement starts at a low, relatively innocent level and escalates gradually. Things to look out for are:

- New friends, especially if older;
- New clothes, especially if expensive;
- Leaving the house, especially late at night.

We concluded that some people are vulnerable to County Lines because they are anxious to be popular, make new friends and are afraid to say no. Drug dealers will target nice, kind, friendly people from clean, decent, relatively well-off backgrounds to help them store drugs, money and weapons, as the police are less likely to search their houses.

It was a very informative lesson/discussion.




#### Food Technology
