## Big Garden Birdwatch

## 26-28 January 2024

The Big Garden Birdwatch has been running since 1979. Set up originally by Blue Peter and the RSPB as an activity for children to do - watch and record the birds they see in their garden for one hour on the last week-end in January.

This became so successful that it has now been running for 40 years and the results are kept and saved as a way of tracking our birdlife.

Unfortunately, this has shown drastic losses of birds, with some birds even being recorded now as endangered. This is mainly due to habitat loss and our changing climate. In school Mrs Wakley's Climate Literacy lessons have been focussing on birds. As David Attenborough says "look after nature and it will look after you". Plus, it is a well-known fact that the more you can recognise and know the names of animals/birds/flowers the more you will come to care for them. Bearing this in mind we have been learning the differences between Sparrows, Dunnocks and Tree Sparrows and also the difference between a Crow and a Jackdaw.

So, do you know the difference between a Crow and a Jackdaw? If not ask your child - they might!
