## Kung Hei Fat Choi - Happy Chinese New Year

Chinese New Year is traditionally a time for Chinese people to visit family and friends and to exchange traditional gifts of oranges and tangerines, especially with the leaves attached. Each year in the 12 -year cycle is named after a different animal and each animal is ascribed a set of characteristics that are believed to be found in people born in that year. If you get a level 3 in Maths or English, you have to get a Level 4 while you are doing your apprenticeship.
You cannot do a Level 1 Apprenticeship.
